Growing up, I saw a lot of injustice, prejudice, racism. This is a persistent imbalance. Knowing and caring the people I have known with diverse backgrounds has made me strive to be a better person, and to be as inclusive as possible. In 2020 as an activist, I walked and chanted with the thousands for George Floyd and too many Black Lives lost. I will try to imagine myself in the other person's shoes. Or try to see what someone really means when they are relating their experience.

Currently in South Texas, I am teaching a majority Hispanic / Latinx population in Emerging Design to build stories through their experience, and their voice. I create a safe environment for every student to show them that they are valid, that they are enough. I practice tolerance and compassion, and offer meditation as a tool in the academic life. I advocate for diversity of ideas, concepts, and disciplines, for students to explore identity. LGBTQA+, Ecology-Centered (Systems Theory), and Metaethics just to name a few inclusive frameworks that I bring, and I encourage students to bring and share their own.
